BIRDS 2017

2017 began well with the Surf Scoter at Rutland Water and other rare birds followed with Green-winged Teal, Cattle Egret, Spotted Crake, White-winged Black Tern, Hoopoe, Yellow-browed Warbler, Waxwing and Cory's Shearwater. This latter species was totally unexpected and is unlikely to visit the county again.

A Woodcock roded again at Burley Wood and Nightingales maintained their presence in the county. Successful breeding by Stonechat was an unexpected bonus. A national influx of Hawfinches in the autumn brought birds to several sites. Our Common Birds Census at Beaumont Chase Farm completed its 26th year and wildfowl counts were received from our regular wetland sites. This year, for the first time, counts are included for the series of ponds at Greetham Valley Golf Club. A request for Kestrel records brought a positive response and the records will be forwarded to LROS. Local surveys such as these enable us to monitor the ups and downs of our birdlife. A Ring-necked Parakeet was an unusual (for us) garden record. Time will tell if they eventually colonise Rutland as they have the London area and some other cities.

Common Scoter At RWNA there were singles on 02~08.01, 05~06.06 and on eight dates between

21.11 and 17.12. Three were seen on 16~17.07 and two on 25~26.11

Surf Scoter Last December's first-winter male remained at RW Dam until 11.01

Goldeneye The only record away from the reservoirs was a single on Exton Park Lake on 10.03

Smew In the first winter period RW had birds up to 25.03, peaking at 19 on 01.02, mostly

on Eg lagoons. At EBR there were two on 22.01 and 04.03. A redhead at RWEg on 09.11 was the first autumn bird with a max. of four (05.12) to the end of the year.

EBR had up to three from 24.11~end of Dec

Red-breasted Merganser A male was in RWNA on 11~13.03 and three females were at the Dam between

13~19.11

Goosander A winter visitor now appearing in smaller nos. at both reservoirs. A female was

reported at EBR on 02.06 and two at RWEg on 25.07. The first autumn bird was a female over Leigh on 23.10 with another on 29.10. Up to ten were noted at RW in

Nov. with another at Leigh on 25.11. We had no records from EBR this year

Ruddy Duck With a national population of below thirty, following a sustained cull, a female was

Chiffchaff Three were on the filter beds at Geest sewage works on 29.01. Full song was heard

> first at RW on 06.03. Ten were singing at Leigh on 30.03, after the first there on 10.03. Other March and early April sites were FHP, Greet GC, TunnW, QF, KQ, Oak Canal, LyndW, PGW and BW. 32 were singing around Leigh on 28.04, with good nos. there throughout the summer - 37 present on 11.08, with around 60 in the larger surrounding area. Late song was heard at Hall Farm, Ext on 10.10 and there were Oct. records from Pilt on 02.11, and LFP on 13.11. This species is currently

thriving

Willow Warbler First heard at Leigh on 20.03 and near HM next day. Just small nos. were noted by

> mid-April with six at BW on 13. Widespread but still not common by the end of the month with 29 singing around Leigh on 28, and 34 on 02.05. The last birds were

singles at Leigh and QF on 12.09.

Blackcap No records in the first winter period with one singing at RWEg on 19.03 the first

followed by one at Wg on 29.03. Well distributed by early April with eight singing in BW on 07. 25 sang around Leigh on 28.04. One was at FHP on 28.09 and there were no more records until one at Leigh on 23.10. with one at LFP on 29.10. On

31.12 a pair took seed in an Oak garden.

Garden Warbler An under recorded species favouring woodland and scrubby areas, the first was

by Oak Canal on 12.04. Breeding season records came only from RWEg/Lynd, QF,BW, Ext woodlands, KQ, Banthorpe GP, CPW and FHP. As usual there were no

significant autumn records and our last was at RWEg on 23.06

Lesser Whitethroat The first birds were at EBR and RWEg on 08.04. with others at eight hedgerow/

> scrubby sites in the breeding season. Peak counts were five in RWSA on 24.04, and eight around Leigh on 02.05. Ten in that area on 14.08 were probably already

on passage. One was at FHP on 09.09 and the last was at Leigh on 28.09

Whitethroat Currently doing well locally, the first was at RWEg on 19.04. Hedgerows and scrub

> provided records at MM, QF, KQ, Pick, Wg (18 singing on 24.05), BCF, FHP and Ext Park and Emp. Two were in Ext Park on 09.09, the last was at Leigh on 24.09.

Once widespread in young plantations and some scrubby areas, this species is Grasshopper Warbler

now very scarce. One or two sang at Leigh between 11.04~04.07, with singles at

RWEg on 23.04, 04.05, and 27.06

Sedge Warbler First heard at RWEg on 01.04 and well established at there, its county stronghold,

> by mid-April with singing birds at GHW and LFP on 23.04. One or two were at LFP all summer with other singing birds at Mthorpe, FHP and Wg up to 17.07. One

remained at LFP throughout Sept, last noted on 30

Reed Warbler No first date but well established in Eg reed beds by mid-April. Birds also noted at

Banthorpe GP, Wg Burrows and Geest. At LFP one or two sang from 18.05~21.07,

with a passage bird nearby at Leigh on 06.08

Waxwing On 02.01 there were c.22 in Oak declining to 12 on 08.01. Two were at Man on 16.01, with 11 in Stam next day. Later records were two north at RWEg on 04.03

and three in Oak on 02.04

Nuthatch Noted at regular sites Ext Park and woodlands, CPW, BW, WardW, FHP, RW

woodlands. Visited feeders in TunnW in both winter periods, two Oak gardens (July

and Sept) and Upp (Nov~Dec)

Resident in woodlands across the county. Three together at RW on 31.03. Treecreeper

Wellintonia roosts noted at Wg, FHP and Ext Park

Wren Widespread and currently doing well. 23 territories at BCF this year (25 last year)

and 45 singing around Wg on 30.0.

Starling In Feb. c.2,500 flew west at Wg on 11 and 300 were on pasture in Ext Park on 25.

Most records were of autumn migration. 8,310 flew west on eight dates between 21 and 31 10 over Mthorpe, Pilt and Leigh with 3,080 on the last date. Counts on nine dates, between 01.11 and 03.12, produced 7,288 birds with a max. of 1,620 on

07.11

Ring Ouzel A male was photographed on Emp allotments on 31.03. Single males were also

near Wg on 18 and 21.04 and at RW near GGorse on 20.04

Blackbird On 08/09.02, 116 were noted in the Leigh area, and 77 were counted along the cycle track on the west side of RW on 13.02. These counts undoubtedly included

many continental birds. 28 were in song around Leigh on 28.04. Territories at BCF increased from 24 last year to 28. 24 were singing around Wg on 26.05, and 18 on

15.06. c.50 were around Leigh 31.10

Fieldfare Few large flocks noted this year. 50 were at QF on 20.02, 300 flew north over Leigh

on 17.03, and 60 were at BCF on 30.03. The last birds were three at RWLynd on 27.04. Autumn passage was noted from 28.10, with 492 over Pilt, 80 at RWLynd and 30 over Wg. On 30.10. 490 flew west at QF and there were 60 at Greet GC. 800 flew west at Pilt on 31.10. Passage continued to 12.11 in the Pilt/Wg area with 1,480 birds counted on five dates. Few remained in Dec, perhaps due to a dearth of berries, with 55 at Bden on 06, and 50 at Pick Plain on 08. One fed on apples in

a Stam garden during cold weather on 16

Song Thrush Records indicate some revival in the fortunes of the Song Thrush. 22 were in song

around Leigh on 16/17/02 and 22 were counted along the cycle track on the west side of RW on 18.02. 18 sang around Leigh on 28.04. In June 12 were in song at Wg on 15 and five at RWEg on 27. Garden records came from Bden and Oak,

where one visited a seed feeder on 24.07. 18 were around Leigh on 08.10

Redwing In the first winter period there were 40 at Norm on 14.01 and 30 at QF on 20.02.

20 were in Ext Park o 10.03, with 14 on 13.03, and the last six at BCF on 30.03. Autumn passage began with 910 west at Luff Airfield on 08.10, and continued through to 03.12, with 2,958 birds counted on ten dates. Two took Pyracantha

berries in a Lydd garden during cold weather on 11/12 Dec.

Mistle Thrush Few records were received. Song noted at BCF, FHP, Ext Park and Greet GC (bred).

11 flew north-east over Leigh on 03.06

Spotted Flycatcher One at LFP on 09.05 was the first and birds were then noted at 14 sites (ten last

year). Bred in gardens at Upp and Wg, at RWEg and probably Norm. Noted at

Leigh throughout Sept. with the last on 24

Robin In Jan. 28 were noted along RW south shore on 19, and 13 were singing there

> on 31. 56 were counted around Leigh on 08~09.02. At BCF territories increased from 27 last year to 33. 57 were around Leigh on 27~28.08 and 22 were in song on 31.08. In Sept 50 were around RWEg on 21, and c.115 were around Leigh on

26~27.09, with 83 in song. Robins are currently doing well in the county.

Nightingale First heard at RWEg on 22.04 with up to three singing there by mid-May. One was

at GreetW on 23.04. Between 02~18.05 two sang in PGW, and one sang in BW on

06.05. Seven singing birds doubles the total noted last year.

Pied Flycatcher A male was at RWEg on 20.08 Redstart Spring passage, between 04~11.04, produced single males at RWVTC, Mthorpe,

> Man and Wg. There was a well reported and extended autumn passage in the Leigh/Mthorpe area between 08.07~26.09. with birds seen on 19 dates, usually

singles but six in the area on 01.09.

The only spring birds were at EBR, one on 06.05, and two on 27.06. Autumn birds Whinchat

were seen between 25.08~25.09 at EBR (three), Luff Airfield (three), Leigh and QF.

Stonechat Up to 21.03 birds were noted at RWEg, EBR and FHP. Two were at EBR in Jan.

> with up to four at RW. FHP had one on 05.02, and three on 25/26/02. A pair fledged three young at RW – a first breeding record in modern times for Rutland. A juv. near Wg on 03.08. may have been a RW bird. Autumn birds were seen from 25.09~end of the year, with one or two regular at RWEg and EBR, and three at FHP/Ext Park

on 15.10

Wheatear. Five at Luff Airfield on 19.04. Autumn birds were seen on just five dates between

20.08 and 09.09 at Mthorpe, Leigh, Prest and Luff Airfield with a max. of five at Luff

on the last date

Dunnock Widespread in hedgerows, woodland and gardens. Eight fed around a Norm bird

table on 14.01. The BCF population appears to be stable with 11 territories, the

same as last year.

House Sparrow Remains widespread, with the greatest nos. in gardens where regular feeding

occurs e.g. c.35 at Stam.

Tree Sparrow A scarce and local species with RWLynd feeders the most regular site with up to

> seven reported (Sept). Up to three were near FHP in Jan and Feb and one fed in a Barrow garden in April, June and Nov. One was at QF on 16.10 and 20 flew over

Leigh on 23.10. with 25 over on 26.10.

Yellow Wagtail One at RW Dam on 04.04. was the first and passage extended to 28.04, with one

> or two at RWEg, and ten over Mthorpe on 23.04. Few noted at likely breeding sites - Cott Airfield, Prest, Stoke, Cow Close Farm and RW Dam. For the first time, there were no breeding birds in Ext Park. Autumn passage noted from 30.07~19.09. with

up to 12 on eight dates and the last birds at Prest

Grey Wagtail Records for all months except June. Birds were noted at RW, Geest sewage works,

FHP, Greet GC, Banthorpe GP and Wg. Present in the breeding season at Tin Pumping Station and FHP. Garden ponds at Clips and BCF were visited in Nov.

White Wagtail Singles were at RW Dam and EBR between 24.03~24.04. with a late bird on 10.05.

Two autumn birds were at Man on 01.10

Pied Wagtail Autumn birds were noted at Leigh: - 75 on 15.09, 25 on 26.09, and 47 on 08.10

Tree Pipit Passage birds were heard over Leigh between 03.04 and 02.05 (five), and 11.08

and 16.10 (12)

Meadow Pipit 30 were on RW shore near the Sailing Club on 19.01. Spring passage in March

produced 535 at Leigh, and RW between 15 and 24. Display was noted in May at Luff and Cott Airfield and GHW. A strong autumn passage at Leigh saw 1,878 birds

between 09.09~04.10. 20 were in Ext Park on 24.09, and ten at QF on 04.10.

Rock Pipit Two were at EBR on 16.10. One was over Leigh on 26.10 and one at RW between

08~16.12

Brambling Most records in both winter periods were from finch roosts. At Leigh birds were

present to 31.03, with a peak of 42 on 05.01. A roost near Wg held birds from 02.01 to 07.04 (last date), with a max. of 23 on 31.03. Up to five were at Whis, Holywell, FHP and Ext village. One over Leigh on 27.09, was the first autumn bird with passage over the area until 31.10. The Leigh roost held birds from 19.10 until at least 22.12, with 19 on 18.12. Two were at Norm feeders on 15.10, there were 14 at

Pilt on 31.10 and one at Man on 30.11

Chaffinch The Leigh roost attracted birds up to 07.03, with a peak of 190 on 05.01. 87, flying

east there on 26.03, were probably continental birds leaving Britain. Breeding nos. at BCF remain low with only ten territories (nine last year). Autumn passage at

Leigh, on four dates between 16~26.10, produced 782 birds. The Leigh roost had

150 on 19.11, and the Wg roost 135 on 30.11.

Hawfinch One was reported at feeders by Eg Centre on 06.01, with two on the reserve

> on 12.01. A major feature of the autumn was a large irruption of continental Hawfinches with birds at three main site; Leigh/Pilt, TunnW and Ext cemetery. At Leigh birds were noted on 32 days between 13.10~22.12. totalling 49, mostly singles, with a max. of six on 28.10. TunnW had birds between 04.11~13.11, with c.15 on the first date. Ext cemetery had seven on 05.11, declining to one by 22.12.

Additional birds were at Clips on 04.11, and one over Hamb on 15.11

Bullfinch Widespread in suitable habitat of overgrown hedgerows and scrub and usually

encountered in small nos. but larger nos. noted at Leigh in Jan. (22), Feb. (27), July (43), Aug. (40), Oct (38) and Nov. (27). Other double figure counts came from Wg

(16) and CPW (ten).

Greenfinch Few records received. None visited feeders at Norm in the first weeks of the year,

and one on an Oak feeder 30.12 was the first for several weeks. Low nos. (four territories) were maintained at BCF and no double figure counts were received.

Linnet Most records were of winter flocks. Up to 180 were around Leigh between

> 02~22.01, with 70 at Mthorpe on 25.01, c.150 at RWEg on 28.02. Leigh flocks were noted from 22.08~26.10, with c.350 on 09.09, c.120 were on oilseed rape stubble

in Ext Park on 06.09, 60 were at RWEg on 16.10 and near Pick on 28.10.

Lesser Redpoll 32 were at RW on 04.01, with ten there on 27.01, and seven in Ext Park on 25.02.

> One or two flew over Leigh, RW and Wg in April. 15 flew over LFP on 04.10 and there were 38 there on 17.10, and 28 on 05.11. Twenty were at Pilt on 14.11, and

six at RWLynd in Nov and Dec.

Common Redpoll One was ringed at Luff Airfield on 27.10, and two were at RWLynd on 20.11

Crossbill There were records for Feb~April and Aug/Sept. of singles over Leigh, RW and LFP

Goldfinch 11 were at feeders in Oak on 01.02, and c.25 were at QF on 20.02, c.175 fed

in game crops at Leigh on 03.09, and c.120 were on thistles near Wg between

03~23.08. At QF a flock of c.40 fed on teasel throughout the autumn.

Siskin c.48 were at RWLynd on 26.01. One was in full song at TunnW on 29.01. Six were

> in Ext Park on 26.02 and 11 at Greet GC on 11.03. Singles were noted on five April/ May dates over Leigh, RW and Mthorpe. 42 flew west at LFP on 20.10 and there

were 20 at Leigh on 05.11, with 25 at RWLynd on 30.11.

Yellowhammer A flock of c.110 fed on unharvested cereals near Mounts Lodge on 24.01. The

decline at BCF continues with only nine territories (13 last year). In Oct. there were

37 at Leigh on 12, and 35 in Ext Park on 29.

45 fed near Mounts Lodge 24.01. The next day 3 fed in a Stam garden and 13 were Reed Bunting

noted in a Mthorpe hedge

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
